


Extension Services

The Tarlac State University, through its Office of University Extension Services, readily provides services to organizations, institutions, and communities who seek immediate assistance relative to their needs. The Office spearheads the processing of pertinent

requests and cascades them to faculty members or non-teaching personnel whose expertise are specifically aligned to the needs of the requesting party. Extension Services are packaged in various activities ensuring efficiency in community.



Our Services



Training Programs in the form of non-degree and non-credit courses offered by a college or unit.



Technical Assistance and Advisory Services to agencies, organizations, associations and other groups and sectors



Communication or Information Services communication and/or dissemination of knowledge and skills to client groups through the various means of dissemination such as a person-to-person contact, radio, television, radio, newspaper and other printed materials.



Community Outreach Activities or extension activities conducted in areas outside the university such as community-based social services, pilot projects, mobile clinic, etc.



Technology Transfer and Utilization or the development, circulation, promotion, and marketing of research outputs or technologies for potential users.

Therefore, Tarlac State University, through the Office of University Extension Services, offers Long-Term Programs catering sustainable solutions to the needs of organizations, institutions, and communities.

These programs are specifically crafted and contextualized anchored to the Academic Offerings of the Colleges relative to the expertise of faculty members and non-teaching personnel.





1 SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT (COMDEV) PROGRAM

The Sustainable ComDev Program provides assistance in identifying the needs of communities and sectors and matching these with the capabilities of the institution towards development. The community will serve as a model by which technical and non-technical assistance is provided by the university to the people within so that a change in socio-cultural, physical, technological, and environmental condition ideal for sustainable development is created as a model, the success and

lessons learned can be duplicated by other communities under the same condition or situation.

The program seeks to provide services to improve the physical condition of the community and provides assistance through technology, knowledge and skills in improving the quality of their lives. Currently, the University undertakes Reform-oriented and Impact Driven Projects conducted by the Colleges and various Offices.

REFORM-ORIENTED AND IMPACT DRIVEN EXTENSION PROJECTS OF COLLEGES AND OFFICES



I2D Project: Increase to Decrease: To further address economic and social challenges in Balanti, the Office of University Extension Services initiated a community partnership with Balemi Farms which aims to promote social entrepreneurship and diminish existing issues related to the SDGs on poverty, hunger, and malnutrition. The project aims to develop and market new agriculture-based products while providing education on entrepreneurship, product marketing, and promotion.

Project Buklat: The College of Architecture and Fine Arts aims to help UAPGA-Tarlac in providing continuing education programs as a bridge between the time gap between graduation to architecture licensure examinations. Primarily, it seeks to contribute to SDG 8: Decent Work and Economic Growth and SDG 4: Quality Education.



Project 4K: Angat Kaalaman, Kasanayan, Kalisakan, at Kalusugan Program: The College of Science aims to capacitate the indigenous people, student, and teachers from depressed community of Victoria, Tarlac in term of knowledge transfer, skills development, health awareness and improvement. It undertakes to resolve concerns relative to SDGs on reducing inequalities and gender equality among others.

Project Hiraya: Isang Landas Pasulong: the College of Public Administration and Governance (CPAG) aims to assist the BJMP in terms of Rehabilitation Programs of Persons Deprived of Liberty (PDLs). It undertakes to contribute to SDG 16: Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions by promoting inclusivity and re-integration to society of the PDLs.



Project ConNECT: Connecting and Nurturing EveryJuan through Communications Technology: The College of Computer Studies aims to assist the Local Government of Anao, Tarlac on areas of ICT Training and Consultation, Multimedia and Software Development, and Network Infrastructure. It seeks to address SDGs on Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure and Decent Work and Economic Growth among others.

Project Up2U (Upskill to Upflift): The College of Engineering and Technology aims to contribute to the SDGs of no poverty, decent work, and economic growth by empowering the people of Sitio Paoay with engineering and technology skills. This will enable them to engage in economic activities, increase their employability, and improve their living conditions.



Project Kasudlong: Extending Quality Service for Maruglo is conceptualized by the College of Education. It comprises eight distinct components that seek to deliver comprehensive services aimed at enhancing the beneficiaries' quality of life in Capas, Tarlac. The project's ultimate objective is to contribute to the SDGs by diminishing poverty and hunger and improving the quality of education.

Project PURA: Partners in Progress through Utilization of Abundant Resources in an Adaptive Community: The College of Business and Accountancy aims to empower men, women, young adults, and out-of-school youth in the municipality of PURA by utilizing the college's expertise in business development and management. It seeks to contribute to SDGs on No Poverty, Decent Work and Economic Growth and Reduced Inequalities among others.





REFORM-ORIENTED AND IMPACT DRIVEN EXTENSION PROJECTS OF COLLEGES AND OFFICES



Aytalakad ing Lahi: Building the Capacity of the Mag-anchi Community to achieve cultural preservation: The College of Arts and Social Sciences aims to train teachers and community members to revitalize the language and culture of the Indigenous People through literacy projects focused on the community's local language. It seeks to contribute to the SDG on Quality Education, Gender Equality, Decent Work and Economic Growth, and Reduced Inequalities to name a few.

Project Start: Sustainable Training Assistance and Revitalized Teaching: The Center for Community and Local Governance Studies and Policy Development aims to capacitate Child Development Workers on Child Care Development and to promote sound relationship with parents and the barangay council.



Project LIGTASS: Localized Innovation Geared Towards Addressing Security and Safety: The College of Criminal Justice Education aims to enhance the Barangay Justice System of Municipalities of Camiling, Tarlac through various projects such as seminars on Self-Defense, Dispute Resolution among others. It seeks to contribute to SDGs focusing to reduce inequalities and in promoting peace, justice, and strong institutions.

Project LUGUD (Lead, Uplift, Generate, Uncover, and Deepen) 2.0: The College of Education aims to revisit existing practices in the teaching dimension in order to capacitate school heads. The project primarily focuses on teaching approaches in the post-pandemic era contributing on SDG 4: Quality Education.



2 INDUSTRY DEVELOPMENT EXTENSION (INDEX) PROGRAM

The InDEx Program aims to provide technical advising and consultancy services to micro-cottage, small, and medium enterprises in order to increase their productivity and assist in graduating them to the next enterprise level. Enterprises identified are provided assistance in identifying and assessing their technical and non-technical needs or problems by university experts.

An enterprise level assessment is conducted on the identified needs through firm walk-through, measurements, interviews and others. In the end, short-term and long-term recommendations are provided in response to the identified needs. Experts will also provide assistance in installing whatever recommendations are to be adopted by the firm and, likewise, in the measurement of parameters to determine impact of the assistance.





3 EXTENSION SUPPORT SERVICES PROGRAM(ESSP)

The ESSP provides specific support services that TSU can offer, namely:

- Non-formal education are programs packaged as short-term vocational courses, food/manufacturing technologies and development of cultural skills and arts.
- *Continuing education* programs aim to upgrade competencies of professionals and uplift the social, cultural, economic, and physical well-being and capabilities of the elderly, the youth, and other organizations such as cooperatives, people's organizations and others.
- *Technical Assistance* are projects aiming to provide expertise to walk-in clients in addressing specific technical problems being encountered specifically for the industry sector including local government units and other organizations/associations.
- *Effective governance* are projects which include assistance on urban planning, land use planning and sustainable development, computerization of governance, etc.



4 STUDENT EXTENSION EXPERIENCE (SEE) PROGRAM

Leaders and members of recognized student organizations are basically stakeholders in this program as they will lay the major role of planning, identifying, fund sourcing and implementing extension initiatives in identified community or sector. It is aimed at inculcating through practice the value of helping to enhance community improvement by integrating extension in their annual program of activities.

Specifically, it wishes to encourage student organizations' participation in community work, to develop creativeness and resourcefulness in putting up a community/sector-based development undertaking(s), to heighten development consciousness among TSU students; and to promote a healthy competition among student organizations through project development and implementation.





5 COMMUNITY OUTREACH AND ADVOCACY PROGRAM



The Community Extension and Advocacy Program are various activities with the objective to provide outreach undertakings such as but not limited to donation, clean-up drives, and other nutrition and health-related programs. The various extension activities are also supported by appropriate promotion, information dissemination, and distribution throughout various university and community stakeholders through the production of Information, Education, and Communication Materials through the Advocacy Program.



6 SPECIAL EXTENSION PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS

Special extension programs/projects are those that are not covered by the regular extension programs of the university but serve sectors that are also clients of the extension office, or the nature of assistance falls within the mandate of the office. This may also be programs or projects whereby the university has been tapped or commissioned by an external entity, whether public or private, to implement such.
